Thankful November greetings, Church!

Since I've been getting suggestions from You-all on what to write about, writing newsletter articles has been interesting but not at all easier. I've written (at your requests) about prayer, Sin (sins), salvation theories, and the request for this month is NOT gratitude (which would have been easy), but violence. Yes, violence! Virginia wants to know what I think about all of this violence today (hate it) and why is there so much violence in the Bible?

Well, there is clearly a lot of violence in the Old Testament: God kills all of the first born of the Egyptians even though Pharaoh had decided to let the Hebrew people go, God sends a plague of poisonous snakes to bite and kill the people when they grumble about the food in the wilderness, God tells the Israelites to kill every person (even the women and children) in the Canaanite towns they conquer when taking the promised land, God sends the Assyrians and the Babylonians to defeat the people and to take them into exile. God appears to be constantly angry, wrathful, vengeful, jealous, and the people of God seem to be the same

In the stories of the Old Testament, the people do not seem to be very different from the people of today, always at war, always jealous and greedy. I suppose we can understand this in humans - we're just humans, in bondage to Sin, but how do we understand it when God appears to act just like the humans? Is the God of the Old Testament even the same God as the loving God of the New Testament? Well, here are some of the things I think. These are, once again, my own opinions. There are good, faithful Christians who do not agree with me and there are good, faithful Christians who do agree with me.

- 1. There is only ONE God! Old Testament and New Testament same God.
- 2. For some unknown and unexplainable reason people seem to pay more attention to violence and war than they do to love and peace. We want to hear about the battle of Jericho and we don't really care that God pardoned the people of Nineveh, but, as Jonah knew, the core attribute of God even in the Old Testament is God's steadfast love and mercy (hesed). God is always more ready to forgive than to punish. We just don't pay as much attention to those stories.

- 3. The stories where whole villages were destroyed and all of the people killed at God's command were written down many hundreds of years after they actually happened. It's possible that the people who were writing these stories down to be preserved for history wrote them to appear as though God commanded the destruction when actually it was just the natural consequences of conquering a territory. History is not really very factual but is the subjective opinions of the people who are recording it. Perhaps all of this extreme violence and bloodshed is just like biblical Texas chainsaw murders. People just want to be scared.
- 4. Lutherans are people of the Word. We believe and trust in the Bible, but we also acknowledge that some parts are more relevant for us today than other parts. We always let the gospel be the lens through which we look at everything else.
- 5. Sometimes I just have to admit that I don't understand everything in the Bible. The Bible is a Living Word, subject to the interpretation of the Holy Spirit. To say that I have complete understanding of everything in the Bible would be a lie and extremely arrogant.

Finally, my sisters and brothers, when we're upset by the violence we see all around us and we struggle to keep from being pulled into it, or when we're confused by the violence we see in the Bible, we can always run to Jesus. In his sermon on the mount (Matthew 5:1 - 7:29), Jesus tells us to be peacemakers, and he tells us how to go about it. Jesus says, "You have heard that it was said, "You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy", But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your father in heaven..." (Matt. 5:43-45) If we follow Jesus and obey his teachings, even if we suffer because of the violence in the world, our hearts will remain full of love and joy.

Next month I've been requested to talk about "grace". How appropriate as we prepare to welcome Jesus! Shalom!
